
## IIIIIIII Making Your Stripy Horse Mask IIIIIIIII




Print out the mask template and stick it to a piece of A4 card. Carefully cut around the outside of the black line.




Decorate your mask using paints, felt tips, pencils or crayons. You can copy the colours from the pictures in your Stripy Horse book or make up your own pattern. Try sticking on pieces of magazine, fabric or foil to make your design look even more colourful. Remember to add a smile!


When your mask is finished, leave to dry.



Hold the mask against your face and ask a grown up to mark the mask to show where your eyes are.




Take off the mask and carefully place it on the table. Put an eraser or a blob of Plasticine onto the table, behind where the eye holes will be. Ask a grown up to place the pencil tip on one of the eye marks, making sure that the eraser/Plasticine is directly behind. Push the pencil straight through the mask to make a hole, then repeat for the other eye.



Cut coloured paper into 2cm wide strips, curl them over to form loops and stick the ends together with glue.

Stick the loops to the back of the mask (between the ears) then leave to dry.



Pierce smaller holes in either side of the mask, thread with string or ribbon and secure with a knot as shown.

Put on your mask and have your own Stripy Horse adventures!
